

PART 2: Fix Your Eyes

## For life to work well in 2018, I must stay focused on Jesus.

"Fix your eyes on Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith. Consider him...so that you won't grow weary and give up." HEBREWS 12:2-3

> What we OCUS ON is where we are going to finish.

The most under-valued, unpracticed discipline of the faith is maintaining a singular focus on Jesus.

If I don't fixate on Jesus, early and often, 2018 will be a year of instability.

#1 A singular focus on Jesus will reveal that indeed, God is working in all things, not just some things.

All Things: Hardship, persecution, famine, poverty, danger, life, death, unseen beings, things today, things tomorrow, powers, highs and lows—anything and everything. ROMANS 8:36-39

#2 A singular focus on Jesus will reveal that God is working out his pre-ordained purpose in me.

Purpose: "prothesis" – a preordained plan

"We're God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works that he prepared in advance for us to do." EPHESIANS 2:10

Keeping my eyes fixed on Jesus allows me to see every circumstance through the lens of God's eternal purpose, and then to bring my response to life into alignment with those eternal purposes.

## #3 A singular focus on Jesus will reveal

"For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the likeness of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers." ROMANS 8:29

Prototokos: prototype – the first of many to come.
