EMPTYING

Jesus emptied himself of his divine prerogatives to become my slave.

If I have grasped what Jesus did to become like me to serve me, then I will do what I must to become like Jesus to serve him. ▶ Like Jesus, I will promote unity. (v. 2)

- ▶ Like Jesus, I will practice humility. (v. 2)
- Like Jesus, I will prefer others before myseif. (v. 4)

WWJD TO

"Being in very nature God...taking the very nature of a servant."

Nature = morphe the outward manifestation of an inward reality.

Jesus, being in form and substance God, did not consider his divinity grounds for grasping; he considered it grounds for giving.

"Being in very nature God."

"Being"

A circumstantial participle. A word that is translated depending on its circumstances.

CONTEXT: Jesus didn't became a servant in spite of the fact he was God, but precisely because he was God.

The morphe of the man was the morphe of God; the outward appearance of Jesus' humanity was consistent to the inner nature of his divinity.

Jesus descended into servanthood to show us what God is like and what God values.
