MONEY AND ME

As I learn to use the gold for the glory of God, I will tap the flow of God's unleashed favor to me.

MATTHEW 19:16-26

A man came to Jesus and asked, "Teacher, what good thing must I do to get eternal life?" Jesus replied, "Why do you ask about what is good? Only One is good. If you want to enter life, obey the commandments."

"Which ones?" he inquired.

Jesus said, "'Do not murder, do not commit adultery, do not steal, do not give false testimony, honor your father and mother,' and 'love your neighbor as yourself."

MATTHEW 19:16-26

"All these I have kept," he said. "What do I still lack?"
Jesus answered, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell your
possessions and give to the poor, and you will have
treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me."

When the young man heard this, he went away sad, because he had great wealth.

So Jesus said to his disciples, "I tell you the truth, it's hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven.

MATTHEW 19:16-26

"Again, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God."

The disciples were greatly astonished and asked, "Who then can be saved?" Jesus said, "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

WHAT WE KNOW

- ▶ The man is young (v. 20)
- ▶ The man is rich (v. 22)
- ▶ The man has authority (Luke 18:18)

HE IS THE RICH YOUNG RULER!

SOMETHING IS STILL MISSING

He believed possessions and position would produce earthly satisfaction.

He assumed religious piety would give him eternal security.

SOMETHING IS STILL MISSING He is empty, but too proud to change. The pain of staying the same has not exceeded the pain of change. "Jesus looked at him and loved him." MARK 10:21 WHY STATE THE OBVIOUS? Jesus saw how good his heart was, and how close he was to salvation. But he was trusting God plus trusting money plus trusting being good for salvation. Salvation through Christ is by faith plus nothing.



INTERPRETATION #1

"Eye of the Needle" refers to a gate in ancient Jerusalem.

Spiritual Lesson: a camel could slip through the needle's eye, but only by stripping off its baggage.

INTERPRETATION #2


"Camel" is the result of a textual error.

Kamelos, "camel" should be kamilos, "cable" or "rope."

INTERPRETATION #3

Jesus was using hyperbole (exaggeration for effect) and everyone knew it.

Jesus meant this to bother us: "Who then can be saved?" (v. 25)

If we do well at keeping the measurable areas of the law, yet fail at the unmeasurable ones, we have failed at keeping God's law.

BREAKING THE 10TH COMMANDMENT

"Sell your possessions and give to the poor."

MATTHEW 19:21

The rich, young ruler's works and wealth had become his god. The refusal to give it up exposed the antithesis of trust: coveting.


THE ANTIDOTE TO COVETING
