


Contentment is:

Somehow having peace on the inside even when everything on the outside is going crazy or is unequal.


a LEARNED SKILL that we use to build a God-honoring life.




THE INABILITY TO FIND CONTENTMENT COMES FROM FALLING INTO THE trap OF COMPARISON.

















THE SECRET TO CONTENTMENT BEGINS WITH REALIZING THAT SIN IS a ways AT THE END OF COMPARISON.


