In order to appreciate Abraham's story or any particular story in the Old Testament,

It helps to embrace the axiom: *"there's always more to the story".*

GENESIS 12:1-3 ¹The Lord had said to Abram, "Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you.

GENESIS 12:1-3 ²"I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing."

"...you will be a **blessing**" = "a treaty of peace" ↓ i.e. **Bĕrakah**

GENESIS 12:1-3

³ I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you."

This dynamic word (bless) expresses God's purpose to give those who trust Him all they need to fulfill their lives in his creation.

GENESIS 12:4-5

⁴ So Abram went, as the Lord had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Harran. ⁵ He took his wife Sarai, his nephew Lot, all the possessions they had accumulated and the people they had acquired in Harran, and they set out for the land of Canaan, and they arrived there.

IT IS VOLITIONALLY RADICAL

GENESIS 15:1-5

¹ After this, the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision: "Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield, your very great reward. "² But Abram said, "Sovereign Lord, what can you give me since I remain childless and the one who will inherit my estate is Eliezer of Damascus?" ³ And Abram said, "You have given me no children; so a servant in my household will be my heir."

⁴ Then the word of the Lord came to him: "This man will not be your heir, but a son who is your own flesh and blood will be your heir." ⁵ He took him outside and said, "Look up at the sky and count the stars—if indeed you can count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your offspring be."
