(1) Tamar ...

"Judah the father of Perez and Zerah, whose mother was Tamar." ~Matthew 1:3



There By Grace

(2) Rahab ...

"Salmon the father of Boaz, whose mother was Rahab..." ~Matthew 1:5



There By Grace

(3) Ruth ...

"Boaz was the father of Obed, whose mother was Ruth, Obed the father of Jesse." ~Matthew 1:5



There By Grace

(4) Bathsheba ...

"Jesse the father of King David, David was the father of Solomon, whose mother had been Uriah's wife." ~Matthew 1:6
