Matthew 1:18-25

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly



But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."



All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" - which means, "God with us." When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.

The Extraordinary Prophecies

A Prophetic Birth:

- Isaiah 7:14 born of a Virgin...and called Immanuel.
- <u>Isaiah 9:6-7</u> tells us Jesus will be a son...from David's line.
- Daniel 9:25 tells us that Jesus is the Anointed One.
- Micah 5:2 tells us that Jesus will be born in Bethlehem.



5 Times in the Matthew Account ...you will find the Birth is the fulfillment of the Old Testament Prophecies.

- <u>Matthew 1:22</u> All this took place to <u>fulfill</u> what the Lord had said through the <u>prophet</u>...
- Matthew 2:5 ... for this is what the prophet has written...
- <u>Matthew 2:15</u> ... so was <u>fulfilled</u> what the Lord had said through the <u>prophet</u>: "Out of Egypt I called my son."



5 Times in the Matthew Account ...

- <u>Matthew 2:17</u> Then what was said through the <u>prophet</u> Jeremiah was <u>fulfilled</u>...
- <u>Matthew 2:23</u> So was <u>fulfilled</u> what was said through the <u>prophets</u>: "He will be called a Nazarene."

The Man Named Joseph

- <u>Matthew 1:18</u> This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was <u>pledged to be</u> <u>married to Joseph</u>...
- <u>Matthew 13:54-55</u> Coming to his hometown, he began teaching the people in their synagogue, and they were amazed. "Where did this man get this wisdom and these miraculous powers?" they asked. "<u>Isn't this the carpenter's</u> <u>son</u>? Isn't his mother's name Mary, and aren't his brothers James, Joseph, Simon & Judas?"

3. Joseph had a perceptive ear to the voice of God.

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." ~Matthew 1:21-22



The Man Named Joseph

4. Joseph had a prompt response to the will of God.

"When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife." ~Matthew 1:24



Joseph's Prompt Response

- a) When He Took Mary As His Wife: "He did as the Angel commanded." ~Matthew 1:24
- b) When He Took The Family To Egypt: "So he got up..." ~Matthew 2:13-15
- c) When He Took The Family Back To Israel : "He did as the Angel commanded." ~Matthew 2:19-21
- d) When He Took The Family To Nazareth: "He went and lived..." ~Matthew 2:22-23

Times Joseph demonstrates his prompt response to the will of God:
