Repentance



Since the disciple's journey is long and difficult, along the way we need **inspiration** to keep us going, **instruction** to keep us on the right path and **warning** to alert us to danger.

If you are not dissatisfied or distressed with the way things

It will be difficult to get going and stay motivated on your way to God. Culture's **promise to satisfy** is so powerful that nothing seems to disenchant us from its deceit.

It is the single greatest **danger** to our discipleship.

Psalm 120 is the **decision** to take a different path.

The first step toward God requires a step away from the lies of the world.
