## Our saw-toothed emotions do not make us any less than beloved children of God.

**Discipleship is** the discipline of living by the settled science of God, not the ever-changing psychology of our emotions.

## Three common sources of spiritual insecurity



### "The scepter of the wicked will not remain over the land allotted to the righteous." VERSE 3

God's purposes cannot be cancelled as they are being worked out.

**Discipleship is** the discipline of looking danger in the eye - financial loss, abandonment, disease, death and declaring ... you are temporary; Jameternal!"

# Three common sources of spiritual insecurity



### The general truth under which disciples live is... "once saved, always saved."

Don't allow your theology, or your confidence, to be tyrannized by the exception. It is not possible to drift unconsciously from faith to perdition.

**Defection** requires a deliberate, sustained and determined act of rejection on our part. Salvation is not a contract that God will break if we violate our part of the agreement...

It is a *covenant* in which He guarantees the results.

**Discipleship is** the discipline of deciding that God takes personal responsibility as the... "beginner & finisher of our faith!" *"Jesus is the author and the perfecter of our faith."* HEBREWS 12:2
